WHY ATTEND?

Law enforcement agencies use a variety of methods to build relationships with the community. One popular program is the Community Police Academy which introduces community members to functions and activities in a law enforcement agency.

This experience will provide the Oak Grove Police Department an opportunity to describe law enforcement the way it really is... not the television version, but our own local, real-life version of how we go about doing our job.

It provides our department with an opportunity to obtain citizen input, assistance, and support by sharing information.

A Community Police Academy can provide stronger citizen-police relationships, enhance lines of communication, reduce crime, and get citizens interested in other law enforcement volunteer programs after graduation day.



WHAT EXACTLY IS IT?

The CPA is a FREE fun and educational 10-week program designed to give interested persons an overview of the many functions of the Oak Grove Police Department.

This is a very interactive “hands-on” experience – participants will participate in several police scenarios which include building searches, familiarization and live-fire police-issued firearms, crash scene investigation, car stops, deployment of stop sticks, emergency vehicle operation, handle disturbances, operate a radar gun, DWI investigations, plus much more.

You will meet and discuss items with SWAT members, Jackson County Drug Task Force, Victim Services, the K-9 Officer and K-9 Merlin along with additional law enforcement personnel.

Classes meet every Thursday evening from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. The program is not physically demanding and each participant may decline to take part in any of the experiences.

THE OGPD NEEDS YOU

Not only does this event help citizens gain a better understanding of their police department, it also gives the police an opportunity to explain how much they need assistance from all their citizens.
